His epigraph for the Inspector General was: 'If your face is crooked, don't blame the mirror.' Good advice for any time period.

Her work on TMB's Grail Project garnered Ovation Awards her for Best Direction and Best Choreography. She co-created the Swiss mask/ mime/dance company, Mummenschanz's, shows, NEXT and YOU + ME, and performed in their Broadway and international companies. Richard Alger (Co-book and Lyrics) is Executive Director and co-founder of TMB and principal artist on all TMB productions. Among others, he wrote TMB's *TRACK 3* (LA Drama Critics Award for Best Adaptation), *Grail Project*, and *The Treatment* (LA Weekly Award for Best Adaptation) and *Big Shot* (part of South Coast Rep's Pacific Playwright Festival). Several of his works with TMB have been translated and performed in Mandarin and Russian. His adaptation of the Lewis Carrol stories, *Going Mad: Alice in Hollywoodland*, goes up in May at the Odyssey Theatre.

Aaron Francis (Technical Director) is a member of TMB and has been for over 20 years. Aaron enjoys long walks with tomatoes, building things that last, solving problems, laughing and shoe shopping.
